What do we have to look forward to in the next six weeks? Food!! I'm just waiting to see what my daughter will make for our holiday tables this year. Here's the poppy seed bread she made last year. So my expectations for a cake rivaling The Cake Boss is not unrealistic.

But on the serious side, we have been so focused on Covid that we are tending not to <u>be mindful of other serious medical</u> events to watch out for.

HEART ATTACK WARNING SIGNS: Some heart attacks are sudden and intense, but most of them start slowly, with mild pain or discomfort. Here are signs that can mean a heart attack is happening.

• **Chest discomfort.** Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain.

- **Discomfort in other areas of the upper body.** Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw, or stomach.
- Shortness of breath. This feeling often comes along with chest discomfort. But it can also occur without chest discomfort.
- Other signs. May include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea, or lightheadedness.

If you or someone you're with has one or more of these signs, call 9-1-1 immediately. Get to the hospital right away.

If you are the one having the symptoms, and you can't access the EMS, have someone drive you to the hospital right away. Don't drive yourself, unless you have absolutely no other option.

STROKE WARNING SIGNS: A stroke is a medical emergency. Every second counts, because time lost is brain lost! Know these stroke warning signs and share them with others.

- Sudden numbress or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body.
- Sudden confusion, trouble speaking, or understanding.
- Sudden trouble seeing in one or both eyes.
- Sudden trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination.
- Sudden, severe headache with no known cause.

If you or someone with you has one or more of these signs, don't delay! Call 9-1-1 immediately! Check the time so you will know when the first symptoms appeared. It's important to take immediate action. If given within three hours of the start of symptoms, a clot-busting drug can reduce long-term disability for the most common type of stroke.


Arts in Hartford
